## RESOLUTION OF THE MENDOCINO COUNTY MENTAL HEALTH TREATMENT ACT CITIZENS OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE

## AUTHORIZING REMOTE TELECONFERENCE MEETINGS OF THE LEGISLATIVE BODIES OF THE MENTAL HEALTH TREATMENT ACT CITIZENS OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE PURSUANT TO THE RALPH M. BROWN ACT

WHEREAS, all meetings of the **Mental Health Treatment Act Citizens Oversight Committee** and its legislative bodies are open and public, as required by the Ralph M. Brown Act (Cal. Gov. Code §§ 54950 – 54963), so that any member of the public may attend, participate, and view the legislative bodies conduct their business; and

WHEREAS, the Brown Act, Government Code section 54953(e), makes provisions for remote teleconferencing participation in meetings by members of a legislative body, without compliance with the requirements of Government Code section 54953(b)(3), subject to the existence of certain conditions; and

WHEREAS, on March 4, 2020, Governor Newsom issued a Proclamation of a State of Emergency declaring a state of emergency exists due to the outbreak of respiratory illness due to a novel coronavirus (a disease now known as COVID-19), pursuant to the California Emergency Services Act (Government Code section 8625) and that State of Emergency is still in effect in the State of California; and,

WHEREAS, as of the date of this Resolution, neither the Governor nor the state Legislature have exercised their respective powers pursuant to Government Code section 8629 to lift the state of emergency either by proclamation or by concurrent resolution the state Legislature; and,

WHEREAS, the California Department of Industrial Relations has issued regulations related to COVID-19 Prevention for employees and places of employment. Title 8 of the California Code of Regulations, Section 3205(c)(5)(D) specifically recommends physical (social) distancing as one of the measures to decrease the spread of COVID-19 based on the fact that particles containing the virus can travel more than six feet, especially indoors; and,

WHEREAS, the Mendocino County Public Health Officer continues to recommend teleconferencing during public meetings of all legislative bodies to protect the community's health against the spread of COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, the **Mental Health Treatment Act Citizens Oversight Committee** finds that state or local officials have imposed or recommended measures to promote social distancing based on the Mendocino County Public Health Officer recommendation and the California Department of Industrial Relations' issuance of regulations related to COVID-19 Prevention through Title 8 of the California Code of Regulations, Section 3205(c)(5)(D); and,

WHEREAS, as a consequence, the **Mental Health Treatment Act Citizens Oversight Committee** does hereby find that current conditions meet the circumstances set for in Government Code section 54953(e)(3) to allow this legislative body to conduct its meetings by teleconferencing without compliance with Government Code section 54953 (b)(3), pursuant to Section 54953(e), and that such legislative body shall comply with the requirements to provide the public with access to the meetings as prescribed by Government Code section 54953(e)(2) to ensure the public can safely participate in and observe local government meetings.

## NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE **Mental Health Treatment Act Citizens Oversight Committee** as follows:

<u>Section 1</u>. <u>Recitals</u>. All of the above recitals are true and correct and are incorporated into this Resolution by this reference.

Section 2. Current Conditions Authorize Teleconference Public Meetings of Legislative Bodies. Based on the California Governor's continued declaration of a State of Emergency, the Mendocino County Public Health Officer's recommendation to continue teleconferencing, and the regulations issued by the California Department of Industrial Relations, the **Mental Health Treatment Act Citizens Oversight Committee** finds that the conditions continue to exist pursuant to Government Code section 54953(e)(3) to allow legislative bodies to use teleconferencing to hold public meetings in accordance with Government Code section 54953(e)(2) to ensure members of the public have continued access to safely observe and participate in local government meetings.

<u>Section 3</u>. <u>Remote Teleconference Meetings</u>. The **Mental Health Treatment Act Citizens Oversight Committee** is hereby authorized to take all actions necessary to carry out the intent and purpose of this Resolution including, conducting open and public meetings in accordance with Government Code section 54953(e)(2) and other applicable provisions of the Brown Act.

- o Measure B projects status report provided by Vice Chair Miller.
- o The CRT facilty is done, there is a supply chain issue due to COVID on the generator. The facility will be approved and moving forward without the generator to not hold up the opening and facility licensing. The grand opening is scheduled for December 16<sup>th</sup>.
- o Mobile Crisis Response hired a second rehab specialist, currently in training. He will be working with Katie Smallcomb to cover both UPD and Sheriff's department. With this new staff addition, mobile crisis response will be available 7 days a week. Currently recruiting for a third rehad specialist for the coast.
- Community Education Awareness and Support: contract awarded to NAMI.
   NAMI is currently recruiting for an Executive Director.
- o Behavioral Health Regional Training Center: held the first training (CIT training) earlier this month.
- Psychiatric Health Facility: Facilities and BHRS have been working on the feasibility stufy with Nacht & Lewis and AECOM. The study is expected to be presented to the BOS at the end of January 2022.

**Crisis Residential Treatment Facility** – RCS continues to work toward licensing, with a target Open Operational date set for the end of March, however some delays with licensing may push this out a bit.

**Mobile Crisis Response Team Pilot** - Two full time crisis workers inland. We continue to recruit for coastal response. Additional funding resources will allow additional teams, which we are also recruiting for.

Mental Health Treatment Act Audit - The audits for periods 7/1/2019 - 6/30/2020, 7/1/2020 - 6/30/2021, and 7/1/2021 - 6/30/2022 are currently in process. The audits are expected to be completed by March 31, 2022.

**Psychiatric Health Facility** – The feasibility study was presented to the Board of Supervisors (BOS) on January 25, 2022. The BOS approved to move forward with using the property located at Whitmore Lane for construction of the psychiatric health facility (PHF), including demolition of the existing structure and construction of a new building. Staff was directed to proceed with closing the Office of Statewide Health Planning and Development (OSHPD) permit of the facility as a skilled nursing facility. Attached is the Feasibility Study and PowerPoint. Nacht & Lewis, AECOM, and county staff have been meeting regarding

the development of the facility.

## **Board of Supervisors Recently Passed Items or Presentations:**

- Approval of Request to Spend \$13,000 of Measure B Funds to Reimburse the Mendocino County Sheriff's Office for Crisis Intervention Team (CIT) Training.

## SUMMARY OF REQUEST / BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

The Financial Plan is broken down into capital costs and operational costs for 9 projects, some which have been approved by the Board of Supervisors, some which have been discussed, and some that are part of the original Kemper report. A budget for each project has been created, actual expenses paid for each project to this point are recorded, budgeted monies for each project to this point that still remain, possible contingency costs, and projected annual ongoing costs, after expected reimbursements, and after the ½ % sales tax expires in March of 2023.

Also included in the financial plan are additional services/operational costs not charged to a specific project.

Actual revenues already received from the sales tax and interest received, as well as projected revenues yet to be received are included.

The projected amount of Measure B dollars still available after comparing revenues (both actual plus projected) with expenses allocated is included.

Finally, a comparison of actual expenses from county prepared reports to actual expenses shown in the financial plan that are broken down by project/services/operations is provided.

It is requested that this plan be used as a budgetary tool when either the Measure B Oversight Committee and/or the Board of Supervisors is tasked with making recommendations or decisions that have a financial component to them.

Prior to the COVID-19 Pandemic, Mental Health Treatment Act Citizens Oversight Committee meetings were held in person in Ukiah. The Committee had agreed to have at least one meeting a year in Fort Bragg. Due to the Pandemic, the Committee moved to virtual meetings and was unable to hold a meeting in Fort Bragg. As COVID restrictions are relaxing, the Mental Health Treatment Act Citizens Oversight Committee meeting format should be reviewed to determine if the committee moves to meeting in person, remotely, or hybrid meetings.
