3b) August 2023 Measure B Financial Report

o Mary Alice Willeford, Deputy Director of BHRS Operations, presented the financial reports to the Measure B Committee. She mentioned revenues were posted through the month of May and the next series of reports will be available at the end of the month. She mentioned that the A87 expense was over budget this year due to facilities costs. The opening and operations of the Crisis Residential Treatment (CRT) facilities and the Behavioral Health Regional Training Center were larger facilities expenses due to increased maintenance costs.

3c) Update and Discussion Regarding Measure B Related Items at the Board of Supervisors Meetings.

- The agenda item for the purchase of 8 additional tables for the Behavioral Health Regional Training Center will go to the Board of Supervisors (BOS) in September for approval.

3d) Update and Discussion Regarding the Status of Current Measure B Projects

Presenter: Chair Miller

- They continue to see more interest of the use of Behavioral Health Regional Training Center.
- Member Moschetti mentioned that the National Alliance on Mental Illness (NAMI) is still working with the Native American Community. On August 9, 2023, NAMI held a "Meet and Greet" where seventeen members of the Native American community were present. NAMI is working on getting a Spanish speaker to help get more involvement from the Spanish speaking community. NAMI was able to train three Native Americans in NAMI "Family to Family".
- Crisis assessment and psychiatric aftercare started back up through Measure B funds and will be up and running July 1. The goal is treating everyone through the end of the year.
- Chair Miller spoke on Fort Bragg Respite being up and running at capacity most of the time.
- Member Allman spoke on the citizens from south of Ukiah having concerns about the new Psychiatric Health Facility's location.

Public Comment:

- Perri Kaller spoke on having more community meetings regarding the Psychiatric Health Facility project to create more cohesiveness.
- O Jacque Williams from Ford Street Project commented on the suspension of the Substance Use RFP and her concerns.
- Fort Bragg Police Chief Cervenka spoke on Fort Bragg Respite was working wonderfully and was happy about Redwood Community Services (RCS) being able to have options of moving clients throughout the County as needed.

SUMMARY OF REQUEST / BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

Currently Mendocino County has been engaged in the process of building a new wing of the Mendocino County Jail. This new wing will be the Behavioral Health wing which has been designed to meet the needs of inmate populations suffering for mental and behavioral health issues.

The build of the behavioral health wing is imperative in serving populations currently housed within the Mendocino County Jail, as well as persons housed in the future.

Inmate populations diagnosed with a mental illness and on psychotropic medications over the last several years make up 22 percent of the population. They are being housed in locations throughout the facility, making it challenging for mental health staff to treat them in a comprehensive and focused manner. Because of competing programs (visiting, religious studies, education etc.), it is very difficult for staff provide therapeutic measures for persons suffering from these problems. The need for treatment and programs of those in custody is increasing, the current architecture is problematic for delivering these services and programs.

This is our most difficult population to manage. The Sheriffs' Office, our justice partners, and the Mental Health Department have taken this problem head on. We have implemented diversion programs that have helped reduce this populations.

Central to the mission of the behavioral health wing and housing unit is the delivery of high-quality medical and mental health services and the creation of modern, therapeutic housing units with program areas for Persons in Custody of all classifications. The quality of the proposed environment, the provision of specialized spaces and equipment, direct access to outdoor recreation and group therapy rooms from all housing units, and other features will facilitate the County's ability to ensure access to mental and medical health care for all individuals incarcerated in the County's jail. It includes new clinical space to provide healthcare services that are required to meet current standards.

including medical and dental exam space and laboratory and pharmacy functions. The new facility will be ADA and HIPAA compliant. The jail will have mental health staff, who will be stationed in the new behavioral health wing of the jail.

The new wing will have visiting areas which are designed to allow persons suffering from mental health problems to meet with family, this will help ensure stronger connections to support for persons while incarcerated which will build support in anticipation of their release.
