**Crisis Residential Treatment Facility** – Phoenix House is open and operational. Clients must be referred through Redwood Community Crisis Services. Clients served in the month of November were a total of 15 clients (unduplicated); 207 Bed days; 4 repeated clients; 1 open bed at time of report; 1 client stabilized and returned to transitional housing, 1 returned to part time work.

**Mobile Crisis Response Team Pilot** – We have three full time staff responding seven days a week. Hours vary throughout the week: 8:00 am - 6:30 pm Monday to Wednesday, 8:00 am - 7:00 pm Thursday, 9:00 am - 7:00 pm Friday to Sunday. We continue to recruit to fill vacant positions.

- November 2023: 79 total calls for response, 51 unduplicated individuals served, 5 calls resulting in 5150 (11% of dispatched calls)
- 23/24 YTD: 287 total calls for response, 221 unduplicated individuals served, 16 calls resulting in 5150 detention (8% of dispatched calls)

**Psychiatric Health Facility** – Nacht & Lewis, AECOM, and county staff have been meeting regularly on the design, construction, and programming requirements for the Psychiatric Health Facility at Whitmore Lane. Demolition of the building is complete.
